

OBJECTIVES

- Create a revenue source to help fund bottleneck relief projects in the corridor. Priority projects are:
 - Interstate 205: planned widening and bridge reconstruction (including seismic) between Oregon Highway 99E and Stafford Road.
 - Interstate 5: Auxiliary lanes and highway shoulders between I-84 and I-405 (Rose Quarter).
- Use variable toll rates to manage traffic congestion in the I-5/I-205 corridor





- Interstate 205 on or near the George Abernethy Bridge
- Interstate 5 in the vicinity of N Going/ Alberta St to SW Multnomah Blvd





Existing Policies

- 1995 Senate Bill 626 governing tollway project authority, agreements, funding, and fee collection
- 2006 OTC adopted Oregon Highway Plan Goal 6: Tolling & Congestion Pricing
- Article IX of the Oregon Constitution governs the State Highway Fund
- Regional Transportation Plan (2018) reaffirms pricing as a strategy with multiple objectives, including system management and transportation revenue


