## SUMMARY

Digest: The Act creates the Task Force on Electric Micromobility. The Act takes effect as soon as it is passed. (Flesch Readability Score: 76.9).  
Creates the Task Force on Electric Micromobility.  
Sunsets the task force on December 31, 2024.  
Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to electric micromobility vehicles; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

**SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Electric Micromobility is established.**

**(2) The task force consists of 19 members appointed by the Director of Transportation. The members of the task force shall include:**

**(a) Two members who represent the Department of Transportation.**

**(b) One member who represents the State Parks and Recreation Department.**

**(c) Three members who represent electric micromobility device operators, manufacturers or businesses.**

**(d) Two members who represent law enforcement and emergency medical services.**

**(e) One member who represents a city transportation department.**

**(f) One member who represents a county government.**

**(g) One member who represents a metropolitan planning organization.**

**(h) One member who represents a public university.**

- 1 (i) One member who represents the insurance industry.
- 2 (j) One member who represents a nonprofit organization with  
3 statewide experience on transportation electrification and micromo-  
4 bility.
- 5 (k) One member who represents roadway users with disabilities.
- 6 (L) One member who represents roadway users.
- 7 (m) Two members who represent active transportation organiza-  
8 tions.
- 9 (n) One member who represents off-road vehicle and trail users.
- 10 (3) The director shall appoint members to the task force so that  
11 there is at least one member from each congressional district in this  
12 state.
- 13 (4) The task force shall:
- 14 (a) Review the existing Oregon laws relating to micromobility and  
15 personal mobility devices;
- 16 (b) Examine whether safety and education requirements should be  
17 required for motor vehicle users, electric micromobility device man-  
18 ufacturers, retailers and user groups;
- 19 (c) Examine how electric micromobility devices can be best utilized  
20 to promote equity, safety and climate goals in the transportation sec-  
21 tor;
- 22 (d) Examine best practices for the use of electric micromobility  
23 devices, including but not limited to use on highways, bicycle paths,  
24 bicycle lanes, public lands, public spaces and mixed-use trails;
- 25 (e) Examine statutory definitions of electric micromobility devices;
- 26 (f) Address electric micromobility devices for commercial use;
- 27 (g) Examine provided education and certification programs relating  
28 to electric micromobility devices; and
- 29 (h) Seek input from a broad range of community partners, includ-  
30 ing but not limited to community partners from institutions of higher  
31 education, consumer advocacy groups and small, medium and large

1 **businesses.**

2 **(5) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quo-**  
3 **rum for the transaction of business.**

4 **(6) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a ma-**  
5 **jority of the members of the task force.**

6 **(7) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chair-**  
7 **person.**

8 **(8) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the director shall make an**  
9 **appointment to become immediately effective.**

10 **(9) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the**  
11 **call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task**  
12 **force.**

13 **(10) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of**  
14 **the task force.**

15 **(11) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided in**  
16 **ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations for legislation, to the**  
17 **Joint Committee on Transportation no later than December 1, 2024.**

18 **(12) The Department of Transportation shall provide staff support**  
19 **to the task force.**

20 **(13) Members of the task force are not entitled to compensation or**  
21 **reimbursement for expenses and serve as volunteers on the task force.**

22 **(14) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are**  
23 **directed to assist the task force in the performance of the duties of the**  
24 **task force and, to the extent permitted by laws relating to**  
25 **confidentiality, to furnish information and advice the members of the**  
26 **task force consider necessary to perform their duties.**

27 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2024 Act is repealed on December 31,**  
28 **2024.**

29 **SECTION 3. This 2024 Act being necessary for the immediate pres-**  
30 **ervation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is de-**  
31 **clared to exist, and this 2024 Act takes effect on its passage.**
