Description: Construct new RRFB to provide enhanced crossing of SW 6th Ave at SW Jackson St. with ADA improvements on the west side of SW 6th Ave. Add truncated domes to the existing island refuge.

Estimating Assumptions:

(Written explanation of contingencies, variations from the base unit prices and why)

- RRFB estimate provided by Charles Radosta.
- Traffic estimate provided by Michelle Dellinger.
- Place domes on existing refuge island cut through.
- Existing ramp on the east side to be preserved.
- For NW corner construction (installation of mast arm for overhead RRFBs and related concrete sidewalk repair) assume that the sidewalk on the west side of 6th Avenue can remain open. Use PCDs to delineate around the work zone keeping peds on the building side of the work zone. For same work assume the curb lane of 6th Avenue is closed for duration of work. Assume ped crossing of 6th Avenue and the ramp remains open for duration of the work except for installation of truncated domes which will require a one-day pedestrian detour. For truncated dome installation in median island and for striping assume standard left lane and right lane closure TCPs
- For conduit across the two NB 6th Avenue travel lanes assume trenchless construction so that 6th Ave can remain Open at all time. Closing 6th Avenue would require Trimet bus stops closures and a reroute for lines 8 and 68.
- Assume 6th Ave ramp from I-405 is closed for 5 workdays for installation of side mounted RRFB on the east side of the crossing. Open ramp back up overnight. Closure needed for conduit trenching, trench paving, excavation/foundation work for RRFB pedestal, and installation of RRFB post/equipment. Additional closure likely needed for crosswalk striping once RRFB is ready to turn on – one day duration.
- Long line thermoplastic on the ramp approaching the crossing to narrow the travel way and create a bulb-out on the east side of the crossing (per ODOT concept drawing).
 Assume 200ft of striping, both sides of ramps. 8" striping each line.
- General excavation calculated for sidewalk work. It is incidental to the asphalt repair.
- The level of confidence for this estimate is low.


